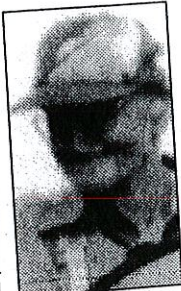
Everett Collins

Everett Earl Collins, 94, Watertown, died at his home Thursday, June 6, 2002.

Funeral services will be Tuesday, June 11, at 11 a.m., in the Crawford Funeral Chapel at Watertown with the Rev. William Hamill officiating.

Burial will be in the Mount Hope Cemetery, Watertown. Pallbearers will be Jim Stewart, Darrell Redlin, Arnold Byer, Vince Maag, Gary Mack and Don Maag. Organist will be Doris Nelson and soloist will be Donna Redlin.

Visitation will be in the Crawford Funeral Chapel Monday from 4 to 8 p.m. and Tuesday preceding services at the funeral chapel. The family is asked to meet in the funeral

He was born Sept. 9, 1907, to Roscoe and Isabelle (Russell) Collins on the farm near Foley. At the age of 3, the family moved to a farm east of Florence where he lived until September 1992 when he moved to his apartment in Watertown.

He completed the eighth grade at Esterly No. 19 rural school and then worked the farm, taking over in December 1942 after his father's death. He spent his life working the family farm, raising sheep and hogs.

He enjoyed fishing, hunting and playing cards, especially pinochle, and playing pool. He enjoyed traveling to fish and hunt, visiting relatives and friends and keeping up with the area news.

Survivors include his sister, Mary Collins Bowen of Watertown; and special friends Jim and Kathy Stewart of Watertown.
